OUTSIDE OUR GATES

There is a lot to explore outside our Watercrest Gates. We are blessed to have several venues in Venice that help feed our souls and satisfy our craving for the arts. One such venue that continues to offer up a great experience every time is The Venice Theater. As many of you are aware, The Venice Theater sustained significant damage last year from Hurricane Ian. The main stage, the Jervey Theater, was decimated and is still out of commission. Repairs are ongoing and are estimated to cost in the millions. Current estimates are that the rebuild will open in late 2024.

Venice Theater has just entered into its 74th season and is back with new shows for the upcoming year. Although the Jervey Theater is out of commission, plays and musicals are still being offered in the smaller Pinkerton Theater and the Raymond Center. Raymond Center is their former educational building across the way, which has been remodeled and utilized as an additional performing arts space. "Tribute" Concerts, which were previously held in the Jervey Theater are being held in three other locations. These locations are: The Venice Community Center, The Venice Performing Arts Center, and in the Pine View School in Osprey. 
